Crime in New York State
2011 Final Data

This report and the attached appendices provide the most recent information available on the number of Index crimes and rates per 100,000 population for each county in New York State. County population data are provided every year by the FBI based on U.S. Census estimates and are used to calculate crime rates. Crime counts are based on official crime reports submitted to DCJS through the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) and Incident Based Reporting (IBR) programs. Index offenses include the *violent* crimes of murder, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault, and the *property* crimes of burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft. Because of their seriousness and frequency, these crimes are used by DCJS and the FBI as indicators of overall crime trends.

The summary includes information on crimes reported in New York State for the last 10 years. These figures include all reports received by DCJS as of October 16, 2012. They differ slightly from those published by the FBI; the FBI reports include estimations for agencies with incomplete reporting, and exclude data submitted after FBI deadlines.



New York State has experienced significant declines in both the crime *rate*—or the number of “Index” crimes per capita—and the crime *volume*—the total number of Index crimes reported over the past decade while the population of the state has increased.

Change in Crime Rates: 2002 vs. 2011


Over the past 10 years, the overall rate of Index crimes per 100,000 residents declined 18 percent; the rate of violent crimes (murder, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) fell 20% and property crimes (burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft) were down 18%. The largest reductions in crime rates were reported for motor vehicle theft and forcible rape (see Appendix 1 for a statewide, annualized comparison of crime rates).

2002 vs. 2011**




Change in Crime Volume: 2002 vs. 2011

While New York State’s crime rate has decreased over the past 10 years, New York has also reported a significant reduction in the actual number of crimes reported. Index crimes fell each year between 2002 and 2011 with the exception of slight rises in 2008 and 2010. The number of major crimes reached the lowest levels ever recorded in 2011, when there were 92,179 fewer crimes reported than in 2002. The State’s population increased by approximately 300,000 residents during the same time period.




Trends in Regional Crime: 2002 to 2011

Not all areas of the State have benefited equally from the historic reduction in crime. The decline in Index crime in New York City was almost twice as large as that experienced in counties outside of New York City (See Appendix 2).



Given the greater decline in crime in New York City, the proportion of statewide crime that each region accounted for has shifted dramatically. The counties outside New York City now account for 57% of the reported crime statewide, as compared to 50% in 2000 and 40% in 1991.




Over the past 10 years, the number of violent crimes reported in New York City dropped nearly 20%, while the non-New York City counties reported a decrease of 15%. Both regions report declines in each violent crime category during the last 10 years, with the largest drop reported in forcible rapes in New York City (-35.3%). (See Appendix 2).

Recent Statewide Crime Trends: 2010 vs. 2011

The most recent 2011 crime data show that crime volume in New York State declined slightly between 2010 and 2011.

2010 vs. 2011**




In 2011, New York State reported a drop of 0.8% in the seven major Index crimes as compared to 2010.

Violent crime categories rose 1.9% while property crime categories fell by 1.3%. The largest declines were reported in murder (-11.1%) and motor vehicle theft (-8.7%) while aggravated assaults (+3.7%) and burglaries (+0.3%) increased over the last year.


Percentage Change in Crime by Region: 2010 vs. 2011

The New York City region reported a 5.6% increase in violent crimes between 2010 and 2011. Murders fell by 3.9% while all other violent crime categories rose. Aggravated assaults increased by 9.2% and this growth was due in part to the newly classified strangulation offenses (See Appendix 2 for further detail). Property crimes in New York City also rose slightly in 2011. Alternatively, the rest of the State reported decreases between 2010 and 2011 in violent crimes (-4.7%) and property crimes (-2.4%). The number of murders fell by 22.7%, the largest annual decrease in murders ever reported in the counties outside of New York City. Crime counts for 2010 and 2011 are presented for each county in Appendix 3; county crime rates for 2011 are provided in Appendix 4.

New York City




Non-New York City



Trends in Violent Crimes by Firearm: 2002 to 2011

The Uniform Crime Reporting system includes information provided by law enforcement regarding the number of violent crimes reported which involved the use of a firearm. Currently, these figures are only available from the non-New York City region. Firearm-related crimes have generally decreased over the last 5 years after increasing during the first part of the decade. The highest count was reported in 2006 (6,164 or 19% of violent crimes). The number of firearm related violent crimes in 2011 was the second lowest reported over the last 10 years (4,863). The proportion of violent crimes involving firearms has been relatively stable during this time period (between 17% and 19%). Appendix 5 provides counts of firearm related crimes for each of the violent Index crimes.



Appendix 5 shows that during 2011, 132 of 255 murders reported outside of New York City involved a firearm (51.8%). This rate was down significantly from the 60.6% of murders reported by firearm in 2010 (the highest rate ever reported). The number of firearm-related robberies in 2011 decreased by 12.5% over 2002, but the proportion by firearm has remained relatively stable at approximately 30%. The number of aggravated assaults fell by 16.3% between 2002 and 2011, while the percentage by firearm rose from 10.8% in 2002 to 14.1% in 2011.

Note: The new Penal Law charges of Strangulation 1st (PL 121.13) and 2nd (PL 121.12), which were enacted in November 2010, are classified as aggravated assaults for crime reporting purposes. Prior to enactment, a significant number of incidents now classified as Strangulation 2nd (PL 121.12) would have been classified within the UCR as simple assaults. The New York City Police Department estimates that 60% of the City's overall increase in aggravated assault in 2011 is due to this change in classification.
